In the name of God Amen. I James Harrison of the County of Hancock and State of Georgia being sick and weak in body but in perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of man do make and ordain this my last will and testament revoking all other wills heretofore by me made -

First. I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Harrison one negro woman named Polly and her child Miles during her life and at the death of my wife Elizabeth Harrison the said negro is willed to my beloved sister Dolly Harrison but not the increase. I also wile unto my wife Elizabeth Harrison forty and one half acre land lying in Morgan County it being the fifth part of a lot granted to the Orphan of Pechy Pelissier decd.

Item. I give unto my beloved sister Dolly Harrison and my

man named Hercules also a negro boy named Eluckin
to be equally divided between them. I also give to my
sister Dolly Harrison one hundred and fifty dollars
out of the money that I now have on hand for
the purpose of schooling her -

Item. It is my will that all the balance of my pro-
-perty be sold to the highest bidder and all my just
debts paid and after my debts is paid the one
half of the remainder I give to my wife Elizabeth
Harrison and the other half to my sister Dolly Harrison
and Cousins Nicholas Ogburn and Willis A.
to be equally divided between them -

I do hereby appoint Nicholas Ogburn to be my Executor
to carry the foregoing will into effect -
