being of sound mind and memory, calling the
mortality of the body to mind; do make and
ordain this my last will and testament in the
manner and form following viz.

Item. I give to my son Edward Wallace one Negro
girl named Tempy & one Negro boy named
Hartwell appraised by myself to three hundred
dollars —

Item. I give to my son Enoch Wallace one Negro
girl named Jode appraised by myself to
one hundred dollars —

Item. I give to the lawful heirs of my son William
Wallace dec'd. one Negro named Hubbard appraised
by myself to one hundred dollars —

Item. I give to the lawful heirs of my son Jesse
Wallace an equal portion with the above
mentioned children, before the division
takes place —

Item. I give to my son Pataam Wallace one Negro
boy named Ned appraised by myself to one
hundred dollars

Item. I give to my daughter Hannah Mearns an
equal portion with the above mentioned
to be taken out of my estate before the
division takes place. this together with what
she may have received is to descend to the
heirs of her body —

Item. I give to my daughter Sally Kemp one hundred
dollars as her legacy of my estate —

Item. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Stenbridge

one hundred dollar & one feather bed, the bed she has received the above is to be her legacy of my estate; except the loan of one Negro to Lewis during her natural life, then to be returned and divided between my children. —

Item. I lend to my daughter Mary Wallace one Negro named Isham, one named Chloë and one named Smith; also one cow and calf, one sow & pigs & one bed, bedstead & furniture also half the kitchen furniture at her death the negroes to be divided between my children this is to be considered her legacy of my estate.

Item. I lend to my daughter Ruth Wallace one Negro named Nathan, one named Greif & one named Crealy, if dying without an heir of her body this property to be returned and divided as mentioned above: also to said Ruth Wallace I give one Cow and calf, one Sow and pigs, one gray Mare named Diamond and one bed, bedstead & furniture and an equal portion of the kitchen furniture with her sister Mary to be considered her legacy of my estate. Also that these two sisters Mary & Ruth have the use of my house and land while, or during life —

Item. To my daughter Hesiak Woodard I give one negro girl named Nancy appraised by myself to one hundred dollar to decend to the heirs of her body —

It is my desire that the price of all the property that I have given off from my estate as mentioned in this will, should be made up

to such as have not received their equal portion of
property before the division takes place, except
that I have given their legacies -

It is my desire that if any crop is begun
at my death, that it should be finished before the
division takes place, and that a support for the
first year be left for those that remain on
the plantation. And further it is my desire that
George & his wife & Isham and his wife be kept
together while they live.

My last desire is that Oran Woodard & ~~Stembridge~~
be the Executors of this my last will and testament,
and revoking all the wills heretofore written I do
hereby acknowledge this to be my last will and
testament this 23rd of May eighteen hundred and
fifteen
