

Testified - in the name of God Amen I Richard Shippe
of the County of Hancock and State aforesaid being weak in
body but of perfect sound mind and memory do on this
fourth day of Nov^r in the year of our Lord 1813 make
and ordain this my last will and testament in manner
and form following (to wit) I give to my daughter
Nancy Hardwick one silver dollar to her and her heirs

I give to my daughter Frances Hounoy one silver
dollar to her and her heirs -

I give to my daughter Susannah Johnson one silver dollar
to her and her heirs -

I give to my granddaughter Patsy Roberts one tract of land
on the Beavendam of Ogallah wherein she now lives I
also give her one Negro woman named Charity and
her child Charney, them and their increase to her and
her heirs forever -

I give to my great granddaughter Patsy Roberts one
Negro girl named Kate and her increase to her and
her heirs forever -

I bind to Patsy Sampson one tract of land on Ogallah
River wherein she now lives I also bind her four negro
Slaves namely big Isaac, Castle, Hampton and Statilda
and their increase, also the household and kitchen furniture,
stock and plantation tools that belongs to that plantation
during her natural life or period of time that she may
live singly on the following conditions (to wit) that she
is not to sell, barter, remove or squander any part
of the above mentioned property so long her without the

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of the said Betsy Tampin, I give devise and bequeath the
property so test her, in manner and form following wise,
I give Charles Tampin and Reuben Tampin at the death or
Marriage of Betsy Tampin the tract of land I have
left her to be equally divided between them except
one hundred dollar out of the value of said land which
hundred dollars I give to Betsy Tampin to them and
their heirs forever.

I give to Charles Tampin, Reuben Tampin and Betsy
Tampin at the death or marriage of Betsy Tampin
the four Negroes & their increase that I have left her
also every other article of perishable property that I
have left her to be equally divided among them,
to them and their heirs forever.

I leave to my wife Frances Ship during her natural life
the whole of my estate both real and personal that
has not been above mentioned, consisting of lands, negroes,
horses, cattle, sheep, goats and hogs, household and kitchen
furniture, plantation tools also all the money in hand
and all that may be due me by note or otherwise
together with all and every other article of my prop-
erty that has not been conveyed by this instrument
of writing and at the death of my wife Frances Ship
my will and desire is that the property and money
so left her be disposed of in the following manner
to wit, I give to my twelve grandchildren namely
Polly Hardwick, Richard Hardwick, Sophie Hardwick
Eliza Hardwick, Nancy Hardwick, James Hardwick
William Hardwick & Harriet Hardwick, Pamela
Flannery, Samantha Flannery, Whitfield Flannery and
Maddison Flannery, an additional hundred dollars,

worth ~~of~~ property and money out of the property and money
 I have left my wife to be equally divided among them
 as I shall hereafter direct to them and their heirs forever
 and should any balance remain my will is that it be
 equally divided among my twelve grand children above
 mentioned and my grand daughter Betsy Roberts. Now
 my will is that my two sons in law namely William
 Hardwick and Peter H. Hounroy divide the property
 above mentioned among my twelve grand children
 above mentioned - the property and money I have willed
 to them in proportion to the number of children they
 have - so that neither of them be accountable to the
 children of the other - Then and in that case they
 may if they see cause each of them make a division
 among their own children, or they may each of them
 keep their childrens land rented & their negroes hired
 out and divide among their own children as they
 come to lawful age or marriage, otherwise they may
 if they see cause either or both of them keep their
 childrens land rented and their negroes hired out till
 my youngest grand child belonging to either family
 comes to lawful age or marriage - and finally I
 nominate, constitute and appoint William Hardwick,
 Peter H. Hounroy, William Rabas and Barnaby Hines
 whole and sole executors of this my last will and test-
 ament hereby revoking and disannulling all
 former wills by me made and confirming this
 to be
