It is ordered that letters of administration de bonis non with the will annexed be granted to the said Thomas M. Also I bind unto my Wife all my lands and tenements during her natural life or widowhood; Also I bind unto my Wife all the balance of my estate both real and personal, goods & chattels (after first paying my debts) during her natural life, at her death the one half of my estate I do give & bequeath to her disposal forever, the other
