Bonner two of the subscribing witnesses to said Will.

It is adjudged that said Will be deemed legally proven and that it be admitted to record.

In the name of God Amen. I David Hitchcock of t: being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

- First. I desire all my just debts to be paid and burial expenses.
Second. That my lands be sold, and my negro man Duncan and all my perishable property that will not be specially needed for the use of my wife and children.
Third. I desire of my executors to settle my wife and children convenient to them and keep them together if possible and raise, school my children out of the amount of money that may be left after paying my just debts as before named.
Fourth. I give to my son John Hitchcock one dollar.
Fifth. My Will and desire is if there should be any money after carrying fully into effect the third clause of this my Will that it be equally divided between

my wife Livil, Joseph my sons and daughter will come to my Will to Joseph Hitchcock, and David Hitchcock, equally between them.

Sixth. I nominate and Reaves and Stephen last Will and test.
