First.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Hamilton one negro Girl Lucy, & all my house hold furniture to her and her heirs forever. Also I lend unto my Wife all my lands and tenements during her natural life or widowhood; Also I lend unto my Wife all the balance of my estate both real and personal, goods & chattels (after first paying my debts) during her natural life, at her death the one half of my estate I do give & bequeath to her disposal forever, the other

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half including my land I do give and bequeath unto my brothers
 Thomas P. Hamilton, George Hamilton, William Hamilton
 & Edward Hamilton, my sister Sally T. Ruess, to them & their
 heirs forever. Provided nevertheless if my wife Elizabeth Ham-
 iltan should have a child in Wedlock by me, then and in that
 case the whole of my estate both real and personal, goods &
 chattels, I do will and bequeath, to be equally divided between
 said child and ^{my} wife, to them and their heirs for ever.

I do hereby appoint my friends James Thwaitt & Woodruff Scott
 & my wife Elizabeth Hamilton, my Executors & Executrix of
 this my last Will & Testament, revoking all former Wills by me made.
