The last Will and Testament of Jeremiah Warren dec^d. being produced in Court by the nominated executors thereof:— Joseph Johnson for himself & wife appeared in Court and filed his caveat against the proving and recording of said Will

Joseph Johnson the husband of Susan Johnson, formerly Susan Warren comes forward and caveats the establishment of the will of Jeremiah Warren dec^d upon the following grounds—

- First. The said Jeremiah was incompetent to make a Will on the day the said will purports to have been made, and was totally incompetent at the execution of the same, on account of mental derangement.
- Second. Said Will has been revoked by a ^{will} subsequently made.
- Third. Said Will has been revoked by subsequent alterations.
- Fourth. Said Will is void on account of interdications.
- Fifth. Said Will is void on account of undue influence used by other persons, and not made in accordance with the intention of testator at the time.
- Sixth. Said Will is void because it was not known at the time of the signature of the said Will by said testator what were its contents, and because said bequests in said pretended Will is totally unlawful and no bequests at all. Thomas Gordon Atty for cave
