Agreeable to an Order of the Honorable the Superior Court of this County when sitting for Ordinary purposes to us directed:— We the undersigned Commissioners met on Saturday the 16th February 1833. at the house of Sarah Morris and in accordance with the terms of said Order did appraise and apportion unto James S. Evans in lieu of his wife formerly Melissa Jane Morris one of the legatees of the Estate of Nathan Morris dec^d the following negroes to wit,
