It is my will and desire that all my just debts should be paid by my Executors after my decease. I also desire that my estate should be kept together for the purpose of educating and supporting my ~~two~~ sons and my wife and when my son John becomes twenty one years of ^{age} it's my wish that the amount of my estate should be made out by Commissioners chosen for the purpose and said Commissioners lay off one third part of said estate to my son John Colbert and so soon after when my son Thompson arrives to the age of twenty one years the estate then in hand shall be made in two shares and the one given to my son Thompson Colbert and the other share to remain in the hands of my wife Martha Colbert during her natural life and after her death to be equally divided between my two sons John Colbert and Thompson Colbert.
