That whereas by the last will and testament of my deceased husband Richard Ship late of the County and State aforesaid he did lend unto me during my natural life certain property both real and personal and directed that after my death the same shall be divided among his grand children agreeable to the tenor of his said will, and it appearing that there were more negroes and stock than I could conveniently keep together - Now know ye that I have on this 11th day of January 1844 fully and freely authorised William Hardwick and Peter F. Flournoy (Executors to said will, and Parents and natural Guardians to the aforesaid grand children) to divide the negroes and stock as above mentioned so as to enable Peter F. Flournoy to take his childrens proportionable part into his possession in the same manner that he would be authorised to do after my death -
