

In the name of God Amen. I William Sallard of
 of the County of Hancock and State of Georgia, being
 advanced in years and weak in body; but of perfect
 and sound mind and memory (thanks be to God) and
 calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing
 that it is appointed for man once to die, do make
 and ordain this my last will and testament in manner
 and form following (Viz) First and principally I recom-
 -mend my soul to God who gave it and my body
 to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner
 at the discretion of my Executors hereafter to be appointed,
 and as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased
 God to bless me in this life; I give devise and
 dispose of in the following manner (Viz)

Item. I lend to my beloved wife Ann Sallard the following
 Negroes (to wit) Prince, Daniels, Easter and her three children
 Thomas Marshall, Sabrina & Phillis. Hannah and her
 two children, Lizas & Rachels. Elmary, Jerry, Siddy
 Elima & Lisha, during her natural life. I also
 give her (to dispose of at her discretion) all my stocks
 of every kind, such as horses, cattle, hogs &c. household
 and kitchen furniture. all debts that are due
 me in notes, book accounts &c. together with my
 present crop, out of which it is my desire that
 all my just debts shall be paid: Also my will
 and desire further is that all my lands shall be
 sold by my Executors at their discretion and the
 money arising from the sale to be applied for the
 comfortable support of my said wife Ann Sallard
 during her life as aforesaid, and then be given as
 hereafter to be pointed out in this my will.

Item. I give to my son John Sallard the

following Negroes (to wit) Easter and her three children
Thomas Marshall, Saturn & Philis and their increase
Items. I give to my grandson Benwell Brown the following
Negroes (to wit) Jerry, Leedy, Emma & Lisha and their
increase -

Item. I give to my granddaughter Ann Barba Brown
one Negro woman Mary with her increase;
now if either of these my grand children
just mentioned, should die without a lawful
heir of their body, then and in that case it
is my will that their parts or parts should be
equally divided between the surviving child or
children

Item. It is my will and desire that my daughter Charlotte
Morgan shall have as a loan during her natural
life the following negroes (to wit), Minny and
her two children, Henry and Prince; which
negroes are now in her possession together with
Aaron and Jerry which are also in her possession
with all their increase and at her death to be
equally divided amongst all her children then
living -

Item. My will and desire further is that at the death
of my said wife Ann Ballard, that my said
daughter Charlotte Morgan shall have on a loan
as aforesaid during her natural life the following
negroes (to wit) Daniel, Hannah and her two
children, Liza & Rachel and at her death to be
divided amongst her living children as aforesaid
My will and desire further is that at the death
of my wife my old negro man Prince shall
be set free and shall be under the care of my
grand & John L. Brown so he shall enjoy
the benefit of their care and as

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it is probable, that an estate or a part thereof will descend
to me in the State of Virginia it is my will in that
case that it shall be equally divided between, that is
one half to the heirs of my deceased daughter Sabrina
Brown and the heirs of my daughter Charlotte Morgan
And also the money that may be left after the death
of my wife for which my lands are to be sold, I
leave to be divided as first mentioned one half
to the heirs of my deceased daughter Sabrina Brown
& the other half to the heirs of my daughter
Charlotte Morgan—

Lastly. I nominate and appoint my friends James
Thwaitt and Ellye Greene Executors and my beloved
wife Ann Sallard Executrix & also my grand-
son John S. Brown Executor to carry this
my last Will & Testament into full effect—

set my hand and affixed my seal this fifth
day of October 1810— and thirtieth of American
independence

Arthur Finnie Georgia Hancock Inferior Court sitting for
Ordinary Purposes of March 1814.
This last Will and Testament of William Sallard dec. was proved in open
Court by the oath of Thomas H. Brodnax & Arthur Finnie (who also
testified that ~~Wm~~ W. B. Heath signed as a witness to the same in
their presence) whereupon it is Ordered that the same be admitted
to record. John S. Brown one of the nominated Executors
was duly qualified to execute the same—¹⁶ 7th March 1814
