 above and foregoing as and to be my last will and testament  
 in the presence of each of the witnesses whose names are  
 hereunto subscribed and at my request to that all and each  
 of them witness my signature hereto signed sealed and  
 published this Feby 24<sup>th</sup> 1852 David Bawling
