I hereby bequeath to Lucille Westbrooks my real estate my lands, money Notes accounts bonds and all the things of value except my interest in lots of land known to her and there (303) two hundred and twenty two (222) containing 12.5 acres more or less all of land in Original 1st East & 1st section of Russell now Haralson County, which land she is to have and use until her decease then the same land known as the Stewart tract I bequeath to T. M. B. Stripling my stepson, who now resides in the same requesting the privilege to him to clear & use for his own use free from rent and privileges to put up all the necessary buildings for his convenience in connection with the said James Westbrooks to this my will is written on one sheet of paper at my hand and
