State of Georgia } In the name of God. Amen.

Harris County I, Alexander B. Honey of said State and County
being of advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory
and doem it right and proper that I should make a disposition of
the property which a kind Providence has blessed me, reserving all
my rights heretofore made by me - do make this my last will and testament.
I direct and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian
manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition
in life.

Item 1st I declare and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay
by my executors hereinafter appointed.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Jane G. Honey, Lot of Land
No (347) two hundred and forty seven in the 30th District
of Harrisville, Monroe in Harris County, and all that portion of
Lot No 348, that lies on the North Side of Mountain Creek in said
District and County, said lands above named given during the
widowhood of said wife, Also two horses or mules such as she
may select at the time of my death, Also two Cows & Calves such
as she may choose from my Stock of Cattle, two Sows and pigs of
her own choosing, Six head fattenig hogs and six Shoots, to the
select of my flock Hogs and 30 Hogs, All such cooking
utensils as she may need, a sufficient quantity of Corn and fodder to last
her until another Crop is made, and forty bushels of Wheat, if
there be so much on the place, One Yoke of Oxen and Cart or
a two horse wagon whichever there may be on the place - also my
pleasure Carriage, one dozen Chairs, one Bed and furniture & Stalls
- Wardrobe and safe - All the above named property, except the said
given to my said wife Jane G. Honey in fee simple - I also give
and bequeath to my said wife Jane G. Honey for and during her
widowhood only, One eight day clock, One large Bureau, One
Sofa, three tables, two wash Stands, two Bedsteads, and furniture
and all other household furniture that she may need, that is
not herein disposed of. I also give and bequeath to my said wife
Jane G. Honey for and during her widowhood only my Negro
Dick or Red and twenty seven years of age and his wife Lucy
Known as my Cook about 32 years old, and her child Eugene
Seven years old, but no further increase of said woman Honey
is given to my said wife Jane G. Honey.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son James G. L. Honey Eight Hundred
Dollars in money to make him equal with John W. Nelson who
married my Daughter Jane G. L. and Mr. W. Bellum who married
my Daughter Margaret R. and John B. Honey, who have each re-
ceived a Negro - to be divided in the like proportion.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my son Robert W. Honey Seven Hundred
Dollars to make him equal with Solon W. Peterson & wife, Bellum
who married my daughters to my son John B. Honey, who have re-
ceived Negroes to be divided in the like proportion.

Item 6th I give my son John B. Honey One Thousand and twenty five dollars
in place of a horse.

Item 7th After my Sons James G. L. Robert W. and John B. have received
the amount specified in Item 4th, 5th and 6th the balance

with my other children or Sons in law above named, then my above named children are to have all the residue of my property except such as have been given to my wife June 9th in Item 3rd, and such as I give to my Son Thomas Neely in other item of this my will, share and share alike, my negroes to be divided by disinterested persons as aforesaid, giving lots as near equal as possible, and the lots distributed to my five children named in Item 4th to wit, James G. S. Neely, Robert W. Neely, John B. Neely, Jane J. C. Nelson formerly Jane J. C. Neely wife of John M. Nelson - Once Margaret H. Zellner formerly Margaret H. Neely wife of Mr. Zellner. That portion aforesaid, or distributed to my Daughter Margaret H. Zellner is hereby given to her for her sole and separate use during her natural life, and at her death to her then living children, to their legal representation, free from the debts, liabilities or control of her present husband or any future husband. And do hereby constitute and appoint my Son James G. S. Neely trustee for my said Daughter Margaret H. Zellner - And that portion aforesaid to be distributed to my Daughter Jane J. C. Nelson is hereby given to her for her sole and separate use during her natural life, and at her death to her then living children or their legal representation, free from the debts, liabilities or control of her present husband or any future husband.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas C. Neely five hundred Dollars in Cash to be paid to him by my Executor herein after named -

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my Son James G. S. Neely in trust for my Grand Children, the children of Thomas C. Neely now born and those that may be hereafter born to him, the sum of One thousand Dollars, said sum to be managed and controlled by my said Trustee for the best interest of the children of the said Thomas C. Neely either in purchasing negro property or loaning the same at interest.

Item 10th I give & bequeath to my Son Robert W. Neely, my Gold Spectacles

Item 11 I give & bequeath to my Son John B. Neely my Gold Watch and at his death to his oldest living Son.

Item 12 I give & bequeath to my Son James G. S. Neely my Gold headed Cane

Item 13 It is my will and desire that all the balance of my property both real and personal not herein bequeathed be left by my Executor and after paying debts and the specific legacies herein mentioned the residue or balance to be equally divided between James G. S. Neely, John B. Neely, Robert W. Neely and Margaret H. Zellner wife of Mr. H. Zellner & Jane J. C. Nelson wife John M. Nelson.

Item 14th I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Jane G. S. Neely, James G. S. Neely my son & John M. Nelson my son in law Executing & Executors of this Last Will and Testament this 12th day of February 1859

In open Court came John M. Nelson Executor, testator and appointed in a paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Alexander B. Henry late of said county deceased as Executor of said deceased and produced said paper writing; And also personally came Nathaniel W. Bartram one of the subscribing witnesses to said paper writing, who being duly sworn deposes and saith that he saw the said Alexander B. Henry sign, seal, deliver and publish the said paper writing now presented in open Court and his last Will and Testament freely, voluntarily of his own accord without any compulsion or any undue influence whatever that at the time of the execution of said Will said Testator was of sound disposing mind and memory, that defendant signed said will as witness in the presence of the Testator and his request and that the said Geo. H. Mullins, Isbary & Scott's At. L. S. Chaplin other subscribing witness signed said Will in the presence of the Testator and at his request.
