

Last Will and Testament of Andrew Huling dec'd - 220

State of Georgia / In the name of God - Amen

Harris County } I Andrew Huling of said State and disposing mind and memory knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling others by me heretofore made.

First - I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for Salvation through the merits and atonements of the blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ -

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed -

Thirdly - I have given James A. Huling one thousand dollars worth in land, Martha J. Rowe one thousand dollar worth in land, Mariah B. Pratt seven hundred dollar worth in land, and Joel A. Huling nine hundred dollars in cash money. It is now my desire that my daughter Mariah B. Pratt receive three hundred dollars to make them equal to my other two daughters Martha J. Rowe and Son James A. Huling -

Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my beloved son Joel A. Huling all of my house hold and kitchen furniture.

Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Martha J. Rowe my Buggy and Harness.

Sixthly - I give and bequeath to my beloved grand daughter Elizabeth Rowe my Buggy Horse Charley -

Seventhly - The residue of my property both real and personal whenever and whatever it may be I desire that it may be divided between my son James A. Huling, daughter Martha J. Rowe daughter Maria B. Pratt, Son Joel A. Huling, and my beloved grand son Andrew W. Huling equally to each -

Eighthly - I give bequeath and desire to my daughter Martha J. Rowe and Maria B. Pratt the above mentioned interest or share to them during their natural lives and after their death to the heirs of their body in fee simple and forever -

Ninthly - I hereby constitute and appoint my son James A. Huling Executor of this my last Will and Testament

Pennington who being duly sworn allopeite and said that he saw the said Andrew Huling ac<sup>t</sup>, sign, seal, declare and publish the said paper writing now presented in open Court as his last will and Testament freely, voluntarily, and of his own accord, without any Compulsions, or undue influence whatever that at the time of the signing of said Will, said Testator was of sound disposing mind and memory, that as a witness signed said Will in the presence of the Testator and at his request in the presence of the other witnesses, and that he saw W. A. Poer and G. A. My hand, the other subscribing witnesses sign said Will in the presence of the Testator at his request and in the presence of each other.
