In the name of God. Amen

I Churchill Parvin being well stricken in years but being in sound mind and disposable memory do hereby constitute, ordain and establish this paper as containing my last will and Testament.

Item 1st I give my body to my surviving friends to be by them buried according to the custom of the country.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath my property consisting of money chiefly to my children to be equally divided between all of them to wit David Salter, Martha William, Solomon Dorsey, Jane, George, Mary and Catherine. Given in all.

Item 3rd I appoint my son William Parvin, my Executor and request him to execute this will according to.

Given under my hand and seal in the presence of witnesses this the 3rd day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty three
