

Last Will & Testament of Cornick McCartan and Rebecca

State of Georgia } I C. McCartan a citizen of the County and State
County of Harris } aforesaid being in feeble health and knowing that
I must depart this life at sometime sooner or later, deem it right and
proper, both as respects myself and my wife and child, that I should
make a disposition of the property which a kind Providence has blessed
me. do therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I desire that my body be buried in a decent Christian manner as
my wife may direct. My soul I trust will return to rest with God
who gave it.

Item 2nd I desire and request that all my just debts be paid by Executors
herein after mentioned and appointed without delay.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Sarah B.
McCartan and my child Nancy McCartan all of my Property
(after my just debts are paid, if anything should be) both
real and Personal and Perishable together all other effects due
to me, or in any manner may belong to my Estate to be equally
divided between my said wife Sarah B. and child Nancy, when
it shall become necessary by such legal process as my Executors
may deem best. Provided if my said child Nancy should de-
part this life during her minority I will and bequeath my child
part of my Property or Estate to my wife Sarah B. aforesaid.

Item 4th I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Sarah B. Mc-
Cartan Executrix of this my last Will and Testament
This 7th day of October 1862 C. McCartan (S)
