deeming it prudent in view of the uncertainty of life
to make a disposition of the property which in
Kind Providence has blessed me to make publish and
declare this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all others herebefore made by me.

I desire to be buried in a decent Christian like manner
at my old family burying Ground in Harrisville County.

I give devise and bequeath my plantation in said County
of Harris on which I now reside, embracing about six
hundred acres more or less, together with all my horses mules
and other stock, my house hold and Kitchen furniture,
my money, notes and accounts and all other property both
real and personal, that I have not heretofore bequeathed
away to my other children and grand children, to my
wife Mary and to my four remaining children, Lewis
Carr, Jefferson, Mary & Madison Davis. To be divided
between them share and share alike.

I desire that my property herein above bequeathed
shall be kept together for the support of my said wife
and the support and education of the aforesaid minor
children, and I desire that as each one of said children
may marry or become of age that it shall increase
one thousand dollars of his or her share and that when
my youngest child shall marry or become of age
that what remains of my Estate, aforesaid shall be
finally divided between my said wife and the four
children aforesaid share and share alike as aforesaid.
