Georgia Harris County June 4th 1834

I Amrose Philips Incoming Minister of the Gospel and the
lawfully of death being a sound & disposing mind make
this my Last Will & Testament

I do hereby give & bequeath to the love and of the love
all my just due said

I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Anna Philips
the following named negroes viz. Saxon and my dear children
brother Ann, Sam, Amos, Susan a girl, Phillis, Washington,
Henry & Thomas. Also my household and all of my said the
Wagon, four mules, three horses, three cows, three
and kitchen furniture, and all other things which I own
for during my natural life or so long as I shall be divided
between my children viz. William & Philips, William Philips,
Francis & Susan & Susan & Susan. And I have given the amount
of one thousand dollars to each of my said children & give to
my son Walter & Philips the negroes, Phillis, Susan and to
my son William Philips the negroes, Washington & Henry.

The remainder of my estate to be equally divided between my
four children named, viz. William & Philips, William Philips,
Francis & Susan & Susan & Susan. And I have given the amount
of one thousand dollars to each of my said children, which
they then have or may hereafter have, all these to have during their
natural life & to their children & to take.

Finally I appoint my beloved son Walter & Philips and William
Philips my Executors. I also appoint Walter & Philips my son
Samuel a girl & my daughter Francis & Susan.
