

Will of Elizabeth Mitchell Recorded

In the name of God Amen. I Elizabeth Mitchell of the County of Harris and State of Georgia being in perfect mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments heretofore made by me.

- Art 1 I give to my Daughter Sarah C. Brooks independent of her husband, and not liable for his debts, but to her own sole, and separate use, the following negroes, Gustus, Sally, Luke and Harris
- Art 2 I give to my Daughter Frances E. Mac Douglass independent of her husband and not liable for his debts but to her own sole, and separate use the following negroes Suley and Katy and her two youngest children
- Art 3 I give to my Grand daughter Sarah E. Mac Douglass my negro Girl Sarah Ann.
- Art 4 I give to my Son Solon W. Mitchell the residue of all my property not herein before named, real estate, negroes, rights, credits and effects of every kind and character what soever that I may be possessed of at the time of my death.
- Art 5 I hereby appoint my Son Solon W. Mitchell sole executor of this my last Will and Testament.
