

Last Will and Testament of George W. Williams Recorded

In the name of God, Amen I, George W. Williams son of the County of Harris and State of Georgia being of sound disposing mind and being desirous to settle worldly affairs while I have strength so to do; do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by my at any time heretofore made, and my worldly estate I dispose of as follows

Item 1st I give unto my two daughters Jane & Katharine Acada Williams one bed and clothing for each, and also one cow and calf to each.

Item 2nd I give unto my son-in-law H. Williams sixty five dollars to be paid out of the proceeds of the estate

Item 3rd I give unto my son Jesse R. Williams all of my stock, consisting of Horses, Hogs, cattle and sheep, household and kitchen furniture, not included in first and second items of this Will and Testament

I do moreover appoint Jesse R. Williams Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and that the said Jesse R. Williams take charge of my Lunatic son Benjamin Williams, maintain and support him as far as he is able

In Witness whereof I the said George W. Williams son to this my Will consisting of the foregoing sheet of paper, have set my hand and Seal this 8th day of January 1861.
