Date of Georgia 3<sup>rd</sup> Henry the Day before said State & County 1856  
Harris County 3<sup>rd</sup> Knowing the uncertainty of life amongst us  
and preparatory to my death myself and my son Harry, that I  
hereby make a disposition of the Property with the important-  
ance and Testament  
1<sup>st</sup> Item I desire and direct that all my just debts to be paid  
2<sup>nd</sup> I give Anna beguashed to my beloved wife Anna  
3<sup>rd</sup> By all the rest of my Property of every description both  
real and personal  
4<sup>th</sup> Item I do hereby appoint Anna Constitute my wife Anna  
my Executor to this my Last Will and Testament. She  
shall make requisition to make out any Inventory or  
appraisal of my Estate Justice shall she be required  
to make any Return to Court. but she may take full  
possession of said Property in her own right  
June 11<sup>th</sup> 1870
