lish this my last will and Testament hereby
reversing all Wills by me at any time heretofore
made. And I first commit my soul to God
who gave it and my body I desire to be buried
whenever my family may see proper and my
worldly Estate I dispose of as follows.

First - I desire my just debts paid.

Second - I will to my dear wife Nancy in
full of land on which I now reside for
and during her natural life, and after her
death said land to be sold and equally
divided among all of my children, and
I give to my said wife one mule and all
my cows and hogs except what I shall
hereafter give to my two children, William

~~and Georgia~~

and Georgia, said stock to be sold at her death and to be disposed of as the other. And I give to Mary Williams one cow and calf, one bed and furniture, and to Thomas G. Horn I give one horse bridle and saddle and one gun, and to L. R. Horn I give one horse bridle and saddle and gun, and to Jane B. Horn I give one cow and calf and bed and furniture, and to Hugh B. Horn I give one horse bridle and saddle and gun. The above property I have given to my five children above named and I give to William J. Horn one horse or mule worth one hundred dollars and one gun, and I give to George R. L. Horn two cows and calves and one feather bed and furniture, and after the death of my said wife I want every thing that is remaining sold and to be equally divided between all my legal heirs, and I hereby appoint Geo. W. Williams my executor to this my last Will and Testament and I give to Martha A. Williams one cow and calf, one feather bed and furniture.
