 Saddle and Gun and to Jane C. Horn I give one
 Cow half and bed furniture and to Hugh Horn I give one
 Horse Bridle & Saddle and Gun the above Property I
 now given to my five Children above named and
 I give to William J. Horn one Horse one mule one cow
 one Saddle one Gun and I give to George
 R. Horn two Cows one mule and 1 feather Bed & Furniture
 and after the death of my said wife I want every thing
 that is Remaining sold and to be Equally divided
 between all my legal heirs and hereby appoint Geo
 W. Williams my Executor this my Last Will and Testament
 And I give to Martha A. Williams one Cow one
 feather Bed and Furniture I do hereby certify that
 said Hugh Horn to this my will Consenting of the foregoing
 Shule of Paper Read at my house and Seal
 this 23rd day of September 1871
