L. K. Wash pot, one Basin, one Brass Trunk, one Under basket, 2 old Blue Goblets, 2 China Plates, one bowl, one tin pan, one Stove pitcher, one jar, one Wash bowl, one soap candle & tooth, one set-of-plate gear, wooden bowls & c. 1 ton, One Bed, 100 Linen & 100 Hairs, 14 split Bott in chamber, one fine Table cloth two thousand dollars in money, and all the 1/2 price of the living between the Collins for my road & the West part 2000 more. All of that just and parcel of land lying on the South side of the Collins road which I purchased of Mrs. W. D. D. in containing three acres more or less with all the appurtenances belonging to have and hold for her own uses in a benefit forever as for example.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Jacob A. Little all the residue of my property not already given in this will, of whatsoever character and wherever found for his own proper use, benefit and behoof forever.

Item 5th I hereby appoint my beloved Son Jacob A. Little & his executors of this my Last-Will and Testament.
