

Last Will and Testament of Jacob Little Records.

State of Georgia } In the name of God — Amen.

Harris County } I Jacob Little of the State and County afore-
said being of Radvanced age, and knowing that I must shortly
depart this life, deem it right and proper both as it regards
myself and family, that I should make a disposition of
my property with which a kind providence has blessed me.
I do therefore make this my last will and Testament.

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent man-
ner suitable to my circumstances in life.

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my Exe-
cutors hereafter appointed.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife S. Little
all the furniture, household and Kitchen Utensils she possessed
at the time of my marriage with her, also one bed and bedstead
and furniture, One Sofa, one Chair and spinning wheel, one
Chest of Drawers, one Sewing Machine, one Corset Case, one Band
box, provisions for one year for her and family, one Horse and
buggy, one bed room, my Clock, my Broad Cloth Clock, a
Wash pot, one Oven, one Bread Tray, one Water bucket, 2 Glass
for Goblets, 2 China Plates, one bowl, one tin pan, one Stone
pitcher, one Jar, one Wash tub, one broom, candle stick, one
set of plough gear, one dozen hens, one Rooster, one Turkey, 10
pounds of butter, 10 split-bottom chairs, one pair of tables, one
dollar in money, and all the rest of the property lying between
the Collins Ferry road & the West point road and all of that part
and parcel of land lying on the south side of the Collins Ferry
road which I purchased from M. B. Davis containing one hundred
and seven acres more or less, with all the appurtenances belonging
to have and hold for her own use as a bequest forever in
full sample.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved son J. H. Little all the resi-
due of my property not already devised in this will, of what ever
character and wherever found for his own proper use, bequest
and bequest forever.

Item 5th I hereby appoint my beloved son J. H. Little sole executor
of this my last will and Testament.

In open Court came John J. Little, executor constituted and appointed in a paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Jacob Little late of said County deceased as executor of said deceased; and produced said paper writing; and also personally came Watson M. Dunn one of the subscribing witnesses to said paper writing, who being duly sworn deponeth and saith that he saw the said Jacob Little sign, seal, deliver and publish the said paper writing now presented in open Court as his last Will and Testament; freely, voluntarily of his own accord without any compulsion or any undue influence whatever - that at the time of the execution of said Will said Testator was of sound disposing mind and memory - that deponent signed his name to said writing in the presence of the Testator and at his request and that he saw J. M. Rogers & J. L. Hall the other subscribing witnesses being said Will together with the Testator and at his request.
