

Concupative Will Jeremiah Reeves decd.

State of Georgia, We James W Pells Jacob P McRee Jacob W Davis and John I Davis were present last evening the sixteenth day of June in the year of our lords eighteen hundred and fifty three at the residence of Jeremiah Reeves married man before and near the line of his death about ten hours before his death in perfect possession of his mental faculties he called upon us to Remind and take notice of what he was about to say that it had been his intention to dispose of his property but had up to this time neglected to do so he now wished us to understand that his will and desire was that his just debts be paid, and that his real and personal estate be kept together for the use and benefit of his widow and children until his widow married and the youngest child became of age at which time an equal distribution should be made to his widow, and children of all effect belonging to said estate, and that he requested and desired that his wife Elizabeth Reeves to see that his wishes and desire in this regard should be fully carried in to effect shortly after which he died June the 17th (Seventeenth) 1853
