

Last Will and Testament of Jesse Berry late Rec'd

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen -

Harris County } I Jesse Berry of the County and State aforesaid
knowing the uncertainty of life do hereby make and ordain my last
Will and Testament -

First I resign my spirit to God who gave it and my body to its master death -
to be interred by my surviving friends in decent Christian order.

Secondly I give to my daughter Mary Adams during her life one half of the
lot of Land on which I live viz; No. One hundred and eighty two
in the Twenty-first-District Harris County which land at the
cease of said Mary Adams shall revert to and become a part of
my Estate

Thirdly All the remainder of my estate, including the severances mentioned
in the second Article of this my last Will & Testament, I give equally
to the children of my daughter Nancy Lennastan which she may
bear to her present Husband Henry Lennastan

Fourthly No part of this my last Will & Testament shall take effect until the
decease of myself and my wife Mildred Berry.

Fifthly I hereby constitute and appoint my son in law Henry Lennastan
the Executor of this my Last Will and Testament - This article
to take effect at my decease

seal this 19th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand

County of Harris } In open Court came Henry Lennastan Executor
constituted and appointed in a paper writing purporting to be
last Will and Testament of Jesse Berry late of said County de-

Barnes two of the subscribers witnesses to said paper writing, who
being duly sworn deposed and say that they saw the said Jesse
Berry sign, seal, declare and publish the said paper writing now
presented in open Court as his last Will and Testament freely,
voluntarily of his own accord without any compulsion or ad-
vise influence whatever - that at the time of the execution
of said Will said Testator was of sound disposing mind and mem-
ory, that deponents sign said Will as witnesses in the presence of
the Testator and at his request and in the presence of each
other and that they saw Asa Cox the other subscriber to
sign said Will in the presence of the Testator and at his re-
quest - Sworn and Subscribed before me in open Court
to the best of their knowledge & belief
