 brought her Children & mine & all of the Stock of all kind also all
 my plantation tools also all of my house hold and kitchen furniture
 to be all kept to gether and all of her Children and mine Humbergs
 kept to gether
 I give to my beloved Francis A. Humberg my new Carriage and my
 daughter Vergine my watch and I give Thomas H. Humberg my son
 my Buggy I give to my son Jesse H. Humberg my Huffle Gun
 I further will that should my beloved wife survive I marry after my
 decease I will her four hundred acres of Land including the buildings
 and an Equal share with my Children of all my other property with
 the Exception of the Command of my Land which said to be Equally divided
 with his Children Least of all I will that my son Henry H. Humberg
 as my Executor Seal and Signed in the presence of
 Test
