

John Davenport's Will Recorded

Georgia Harris County.

In the name of God Amen! I John Davenport of said State & County being of advanced age, and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world, deem it right and proper both as respects myself and my family, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by

Item first I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my executors here in after named as soon as circumstances will admit.

Item second I give and devise to my beloved wife Nancy Davenport one negro woman named Sarah Ame 38 years of age, and her two children, one named Lot Leary a boy about 16 years of age and the other Dennis a boy about 12 years of age to her own proper use, benefit and behoof forever, with full power to dispose of the same at any time before or at her death as she may think proper. I also give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Davenport in the same unreserved manner my pleasure carriage and two mules.

Item third I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Davenport all my house hold and Kitchen furniture to have and to hold the same for her proper use to dispose of in such manner as she may deem proper.

Item fourth I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Davenport for and during her natural life for her use and benefit the following negroes viz: Charley 55 years old, Charles 37 yrs old Ame 48 yrs old Mary 65 yrs old Reuben 30 yrs old Mary 35 yrs old James 67 yrs old Amelia 37 yrs old and Wesley 15 yrs old, and at her death to be equally divided between those of my children or their heirs as are named in this will as legatees.

Item fifth I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Davenport for and during her natural life the house in which I now reside and five hundred and Eighty (88) acres of land adjoining and comprising portions of said farmstead and all the stock, horses &c of whatsoever description all plantation and farming utensils, buildings and appurtenances appertaining to same, to be kept for the use of the plantation for the use of my wife and at her death all to be sold as soon as convenient for the benefit of the legatees named in this will.

Item sixth I give and bequeath to my daughter Catharine S. Bennett one negro man named Cleon about 45 yrs of age, and one negro boy named Henry Clay about 9 yrs of age, to her own proper use and benefit forever, with full power to dispose of the same at any time before or at her death as she may think proper.

Item seventh I give and bequeath to my son David Benedict Davenport for and during his natural life one lot of land known as the Saw Mill tract together with all the buildings and fixtures appertaining to the same and one negro man by the name of Tom about 40 yrs of age, and a boy named John about 12 yrs of age. Should my son David Benedict die childless the property named in this item shall revert to his brother and sisters named in this instrument or their heirs.

Item eighth I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann L. Colman one negro girl by the name of Sophronia 16 yrs old and one negro boy by the name of Oliver 12 yrs old and the sum of One Thousand Dollars to be paid to her at her mother's death; all to her own use and benefit forever with full power to dispose of the same at any time before or at death, as she may think proper. I do in that my daughter

and her children should live with my wife as she has here before
at her own option.

Item ninth I give and bequeath to my son John Davenport for and during his
natural life and then to his Son Marcus Culhagan Woman by the
name of Rebecca 29 yrs of age and her child Henderson 3 yrs old
and a negro boy by the name of Whitfield 12 yrs old. After the death
of my son John & his property to be enjoyed by his son Marcus forever
I give also a legacy to my son Francis Marion Davenport one negro
woman named Emily and her nine Children to wit: Frances James
Miley, Martha, Robert, Lawson, Jessie, William and Laura all to
his own proper use and behoof forever with full power to dispose
of the same at any time before or at his death as he may think proper

Item eleventh I give and bequeath to my son James Monroe Davenport in addition
to what I have heretofore given him one lot of land (303^{1/2}) acres
in Carroll County number 150, and four thousand dollars at
his mothers death. All for his use and behoof forever.

Item twelfth I give and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Polly Elam one
negro woman named Rachael and her three children Jesse, Sandy
and Hetty now in their possession; one lot of land in Pataski
County number 246, and one thousand dollars at my wife's death
all of which shall forever be exempt from the debts or beyond the
Control of their father Elijah Elam the same to remain for their
use and behoof forever.

Item thirteenth I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth A. Griggs, one negro
woman named Rhoda 25 yrs of age, and her child Charlotte an
infant for the benefit of her and her children and I hereby
appoint my wife Nancy Davenport as Trustee for the said Elizabeth
A. and her children. Same property for their use and benefit
forever.

Item fourteenth I give and bequeath to my son Thos Jefferson Davenport one negro man
named Nathan 24 yrs of age and one negro man named Mark 18 yrs of
age, and I appoint his Mother his Trustee for the proper management
of his property, which is not to be subject to any debts my son Thos has
by contract all for his proper use and benefit forever.

Item fifteenth I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Ann Catharine Johnson
five hundred dollars and no more. She is not to come in for another
share at my wifes death.

Item sixteenth The balance of my Real Estate not mentioned in this will is to be sold as
soon after death as convenient for the benefit of my Legatees Creditors
Item seventeenth Should any portion of my effects of whatever description have been
omitted, I will and bequeath the same to my wife Nancy Davenport
during her natural life and at her death to be divided equally
among my Legatees.

The eighteenth I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Nancy Davenport Executing
and my Son David Benedict Davenport Executor to this my last
will and Testament the 15th day of September in the year of
our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and forty Seven (1837)
