

Last Will and Testament of John Miller Sr. Recommen

State of Georgia | In the name of God. Amen
Harris County | I John Miller of said State and County, being of
advanced age and knowing that I must, according to nature, soon
or later depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects
my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of my
property both which a Heavly Providence has blessed me, do therefore
make this my Last Will and Testament, 2

1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Chris-
tian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life

2^d Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay,
by my Executors herein after appointed

3^d Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy all my Land and
Estate lying on the east side of the road leading from Hamilton
to Goodwin's Cross Roads, with the improvements thereon, together
with all my House hold and Kitchen furniture, Plantation tools
Wagon & Cart, Horses, Mules, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep and every other
Species of Stock I now have.

4th Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy - Six of my Negroes
of her own Selection, Just such as she may desire, said property
so named in item third, also the Negroes named in this item is
only given to my said wife Nancy for and during her natural life
and at her death to be equally divided between my then living
children. One portion to go to my Grand children by my deceased
Daughter Soccie Robt. to wit: Caroline & Eliza - Another portion
to go to my Daughter Concord Robt and her children, free from
the Control of her present Husband or his debts or any future
Husband - the other portions to be equally divided between my six
sons and Janet's Wife of Jesse Revel (my oldest daughter)
my last mentioned mentioned Daughter to receive her portion in
the same manner of my other Daughter, that is I give her portion
to her and her children free from the Control or debts of her present
or any future husband; My sons to wit: James, Alfred, John,
Solomon, Milton, Mark to receive their portions of the above men-
tioned property in full simple at her death, that is the death of my wife

5th Item I give and bequeath to my above named children and Grand
children, to wit: James, Alfred, John, Solomon, Milton, Mark, Janet
Revel & her children, Soccie Robt and her children and
Caroline & Eliza Robt, my Grand children the balance of my prop-
erty both Land and Negroes, debts owing to me - other than the prop-
erty given to my wife in Item 3^d and 4th the property hereby bequeathed
in this Item is given to my said children in the same manner
the property they are to receive from their Mother at her death in
Items 3 & 4. That is it given (and I wish no mistake) to my be-
loved Daughter and their children, free from the Control or debts
of their present or future Husbands to my sons in full simple at
my death

6th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my sons James Miller, Alfred Miller,
John Miller, Solomon Miller, Milton Miller and Mark Miller
Executors of this my Last Will and Testament

Mc Gee Executor constitution and appointed in a paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of John Mc Gee late of said County deceased as Executor of said deceased, and produced said paper writing; and also personally came James M. Mobley and W. H. Barren two of the Subscribers, witnesses to said paper writing who being duly sworn depose and say that they saw the said John Mc Gee sign seal declare and publish the said paper writing now presented in open Court as his last Will and Testament freely voluntarily of his own accord without any compulsion or any undue influence whatever - that at the time of the execution of said Will the said Testator was of sound disposing mind and memory - that the said witnesses signed said Will as witnesses in the presence of the Testator and at his request, and in the presence of each other and that they saw S. B. Redell and Geo. Mullins the other Subscribers witness said Will in the presence of the Testator and at his request.
