80 in the 19th District the East portion being given to my

Marion Alfred my farming implements carriage and
one Harrow and fifty Dollars in money out of the
first Crop Kansas every year after my death to buy
him a Horse and as the death of my wife the said
Marion is to have all that I have given a him in fee
