

Last Will & Testament of Jos. W. Kinsey dec'd & Recordee.

State of Georgia } In the name of God - Amen.

Warren County } I Joseph W. Kinsey of said State and County, being of lawful age, of sound and disposing mind and memory, being about to believe for the ~~Year~~ and knowing that life is uncertain, I deem it right and proper that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament; my sole I trust - should return to rest - with the God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits of Jesus Christ. I desire that all my just debts be paid by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed -

First -

Secondly

I give, bequeath and devise, to all my beloved Brothers and Sisters severally and equally, when my youngest Brother, shall become of age, (one Negro woman named Mary, about twenty six years of age, and her two children Francis six years old and Ben three years old, to their own proper use benefit and behoof, forever for ever.

Third -

I desire that my Father Lazarus Kinsey should keep the above named Negroes in his possession, and control, until my youngest Brother be come of age, when they shall be equally divided as above specified in their Decence.

Fourth -

I hereby constitute and appoint my Father Lazarus Kinsey Executor of this my last Will and Testament this July 12th 1861

Personally appeared in open Court Lazarus Kinsey, constituted and appointed in a paper writing, purporting to be the last Will & Testament of Joseph W.
