State of Georgia | In the name of God - Amen
 Deems County I Andeth Davis of said State and County being of aduan
 sea age but of sound minde but infirm in body; and knowing that I
 must shortly depart this life, doon it right and proper that I should make
 some disposition of the little property, with which a kind Providence has
 blessed me; do therefore make this my last Will and Testament revoking
 and settling aside all other wills made by me.

- Item 1st I desir that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
 suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust
 shall return to rest with God who gave it.
- Item 2nd I desire that all my just debts be paid well as little delay or trouble
 which I am thankful are here from, as I do not wish that my
 creditor, should not receive their dues.
- Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my beloved son James G. Davis an equal
 division of all my property, whom sold or dispersed up, and do appoint
 my son James G. Davis Trustee for same. I do wish that he may possess
 said James Share of my estate, and let him have none after his
 less hands only what will support him, and if any of said James
 share is left at his death to be equally divided between all my other
 Legatees.
- Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved son James G. Davis an equal
 share of all my estate when sold or dispersed up.
- Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my beloved son William C. Davis an
 equal share of all my estate when sold or dispersed up.
- Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my beloved son John Davis an equal
 share of all my estate when sold or dispersed up.
- Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Mary Davis wife
 of George B. Davis an equal share of all my estate when sold or dispersed
 up for the sole use of said Mary Davis and her heirs to be their
 own property in fee simple.
- Item 8th I give and bequeath unto the four sons of my deceased daughter Callie
 Post who was the wife of Allen Post viz; Wiley Post, Allen Post, John
 Post and Davis Post, an equal share with the other Legatees viz; one
 share of all my estate when sold or dispersed up to be equally divided
 between said heirs.
- Item 9th I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth Jones wife
 of John R. Davis to her and her heirs of her body one equal share of
 all my estate when sold or dispersed up.
- Item 10th I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Harriet Callicay wife
 of William L. Callicay an equal share of all my estate to her and her
 heirs of her body when sold or dispersed up.
- Item 11th I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Solitta Headly wife
 of Freeman Headly an equal share of all my estate to her and the heirs
 of her body when sold or dispersed up.
- Item 12th I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Lucy Hengger wife
 of Marshall Hengger an equal share of all my estate to her and the heirs
 of her body when sold or dispersed up.
- Item 13th I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Sam Lyle wife of
 James Lyle ten dollars, believing she has already had her share of
 my estate.

Whereas I Judy Davis did, on the thirtieth day of Harris County, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty eight, sign, seal and declare and publish my last Will and Testament in presence of Jane G. Honey, George S. Morris & A. B. Honey who do now bear their said Testament. Now Whereas I am desirous of altering and changing some bequest and devise I make First, I revoke and annul this part of Item 3rd as relates to my son John C. Davis, relating to the trusteeship of James G. Davis - Said John C. Davis to have his own share in his own hands to do with it as he sees fit.

I also revoke and annul Item Sixth as relates to my son Joshua Davis. In place of his equal share I give and bequeath unto him my house and buildings, and the lands attached thereto or lot of land 40. two hundred and forty acres in the twentieth district of formerly Muscogee now Harris County - to have and to hold said houses and lands so bequeathed of me in fee simple.

I also revoke and annul so much of Item Eight as relates to the four sons of my deceased daughter Catharine Post as her heirs and devise I give and bequeath her share unto the Children of Allen Post by his first wife by this Codicil this October the second day of October A.D. 1858 My son Joshua Davis and Son M. Bergman to execute this my last Will and Testament

Adjourned Term March Court of Ordinary March 7 - 1865 -

Judith S. J. Davis the nominated & appointed Executor in a Codicil to a paper writing purporting to be the last Will & Testament of Judith Davis died late of Baria County having produced said paper writing dated July 13th 1858 and said Codicil dated October Second 1862 for Probate, since Laura A. Cornett one of the subscribing witnesses to said Codicil having come into Court and being duly sworn says that she signed said Codicil as a Subscribing witness at the request of the said Judith Davis, in her presence that she saw the said Judith sign seal publish and declare the said Codicil as part of her last Will and Testament freely, voluntarily of her own accord without any compulsion or any undue influence whatever, on the day therein stated knew that she was of sound disposing mind and memory at the time of signing said Codicil, and that she acknowledged the said paper writing now presented to her last Will and Testament. She further swears that she saw Anna G. Hester & Abby B. Hester the other Subscribing witnesses to said Codicil sign said Codicil as witnesses at the request of the said Judith Davis in her presence & in the presence of each other, also that Abby B. Hester is dead and Anna G. Hester has removed to the State of Alabama. Given to and Subscribed before me
