I want my burial expenses and just debts paid also each one of my children made as near equal as my effects can be made to do it. Some of them have less until my effects cannot bring them even. When J. Davis has had eight hundred dollars. James A. Davis has had Fifteen Dollars and Sixty Dollars and Jacob H. Davis and Ellison T. Cullen each of them has had Thirty Dollars and Fifty Five Dollars. Dennis Stalton has had one thousand Dollars & J. Coggins has had Seven Hundred and Sixty Dollars. William H. Davis has had four hundred and Forty Dollars. George L. Davis has had eight hundred and Seven Dollars. W. G. Blackman has had four hundred and Sixty Dollars. C. M. Day has had one hundred and Sixty Dollars. Josephine Johnson has had four hundred and One. Forty Dollars & C. C. Coggin has had four hundred and One. Forty Dollars. The Davis has had four hundred and One. Thirty Six Dollars.

I appoint each of my executors to this my last will and Testament that I have made in the presence of us March 29th 1871
