

Last Will and Testament of Killis W. Roberts Recorded

State of Georgia I. In the name of God. — Amen

Harris County I. Killis W. Roberts of said State and county being weak in body, and not knowing the time of my departure from this world, and being desirous of disposing of my property by will, do hereby ordain, publish and declare this my Last Will and Testament.

Item 1st I desire and direct my body to be buried by the side of my wife in a plain metallic coffin; and that a plain Granite or Marble tomb stone be placed over us, and a plain, strong iron railing be placed around us.

Item 2^d I give and devise to my oldest son Napoleon B. the following negroes, to wit: Sam, and Hearnis his wife, and Charity their daughter, and a small negro girl Eliza, another small girl Silvey and another small one Emily, and the old man Gilbert.

Item 3^d I bequeath to my son Francis the following negroes, to wit: Caroline his wife; Linney a young woman; Minny a girl, Louise a small girl, and also Adaline and her child. I add to his portion in consideration of said son's services to me.

Item 4th I bequeath to my daughter Mary C. and her children the following negroes, to wit: Gilford and Emily his wife and Emily the daughter of Gilford and Emily, and Ann a young woman, and Gilford the son of Gilford & Emily, and Nancy a little girl, and the old woman Hearnis.

Item 5th I bequeath to my daughter Sarah Elizabeth and her children the following negroes, viz: George, and Sidney and Sile and Healy and Noony, and Julia, and Virey.

Item 6th I bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Thomas (and her children) the following negroes, viz: Heriam and Martha and Sophia and Ageline alias York, and also Dinah and her child in consideration of future schooling and raising.

Item 7th It is my desire that the debts of my estate shall be paid from the proceeds of my farm, and for this purpose, I desire that the negroes and implements of husbandry be kept together on the farm until the debts are paid by the proceeds of their labor.

Item 8th It is my desire, and I hereby direct that neither of my children shall bring a wife or husband into my house during the time that my property is kept together for the purpose of paying the debts of the estate; after I direct that after the debts are paid my two children Sarah Elizabeth and Mary C. shall draw out their portion of property, and divide homes for themselves, leaving my son Francis, and my two daughters Sarah Elizabeth, and Rebecca Thomas in possession of the first out-Homestead, by such an arrangement among themselves, as will secure an equal division of all my property not herein before allotted, to each one; And I hereby appoint my son Francis the sole Trustee for my two daughters Sarah Elizabeth and Rebecca Thomas until such time that they shall have married or be come of legal age to act for themselves.

Item 9th It is my desire, and I hereby direct that a lot of forty acres (40) I own in Union County (formerly Cherokee County) Georgia in the Gold region be disposed of as my children may choose.

Item 10th I hereby resign from the sale of my slaves, forever, a spot of ground situated in the same, containing an acre made by a

running fifty yards North and fifty yards South, and fifty yards West of
my grave.

I hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Napoleon B. and Francis
Roberts Executors of this my will This 29 day of August 1861.
