- 1 Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and  
christian like order manner
- 2 Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay  
by my Executor herein after named I appointed
- 3 Item I give bequeath and devise to my beloved sister Mrs. A. Myhand  
widow of Jesse Myhand deceased one thousand dollars to her  
own proper use benefit and behoof forever with full power  
to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem  
proper
- 4 Item I give bequeath and devise the remaining portion of my  
estate to my dear colored brother and sisters or unto the  
heirs of their bodies: Namely Felix J. Woodard deceased  
deceased her heirs Martha M. Thouton deceased her heirs, and  
James M. Woodard to them own proper use and benefit
- I hereby constitute & appoint <sup>my</sup> Gustavus A. Myhand Executor  
of this my last will and testament This May the 6<sup>th</sup> 1867
