

Martha Wright's Last Will & Testament

State of Georgia Harris County In the name of God
Wright of said County and State being of advanced age and
feeling that I must shortly depart this life I do right and
properly as respects my family and myself that I should
make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence
has blessed me with therefore make this my last will and testament
hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and
Christian like manner suitable to my Circumstances and condition in life
my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it and hope for
Eternal salvation through the merits and attachment of the blessed Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed and
I humbly trust enjoyed.

2nd Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by
my executors herein after appointed as I am unwilling my creditors should
be delayed in their rights especially as there is no need of delay.

3rd Item I give bequeath and devise unto my son Joel Culpepper all my
Negroes to him than a woman and fact a man. I also a girl
Manuel a boy and before a girl to him for ever.

4th Item I constitute and appoint my son Joel Culpepper executor of this my
last will and testament this day 14th 1833.

Wm. G. Brighttower Will

State of Georgia In the name of God Amen.

I William G. Brighttower of the County and State aforesaid being of sound mind and memory I do hereby declare and witness that I make and entitl myself this day of the month of April and year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five this day of my life to my wife and proper wife as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of this property without much a scruple or reluctance. Now therefore I do this day make this my last will and testament leaving nothing at all unprovided for me and my wife.

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in decent and Christian like manner.

Item 2^d I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my Executor herein after appointed.

Item 3rd I will and bequeath to Seaborn G. Brighttower the sum of my first Wife but not my Son the sum of one dollar and no more.

Item 4th I will and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Satterwhite the children she now has and those she may hereafter have by her present or a future husband, one hundred dollars or his or her disposition of her present or future husband, nine hundred and eighty five dollars, over and above what she has already received from me to be paid to her by my Executor hereinafter named, and at her death to her then living children, and I hereby appoint Thomas A. Brighttower, Drury G. Brighttower my son, Trustee for my said Daughter Nancy Satterwhite.

Item 5 I will and bequeath to my son Thomas A. Brighttower one thousand and fifty five dollars in money to be paid to him by my Executor here and above what he has already received from me.

Item 6 I will and bequeath to my son Peter G. Brighttower seven hundred and fifty dollars and fifty five dollars in money to be paid to him by my Executor here and above what he has already received from me.

Item 7 I will and bequeath to my son David G. Brighttower one thousand and sixty five dollars in money to be paid to him by my Executor here and above what he has already received from me.

Item 8 I will and bequeath to my son James F. Brighttower seven hundred and fifty five dollars in money to be paid to him by my Executor here and above what he has already received from me.

Item 9 I will and bequeath to my Daughter Anna G. Brighttower wife of Wm. G. Brighttower a negro woman by the name of Sarah sixteen years old, complexion brown or tan in the possession of the said wife G. Brighttower and the sum of One thousand Dollars, and fifty five Dollars in money to be paid to them by my Executor here and above what she has already received from me.

Item 10 I will and bequeath to my daughter Mary Jane Brighttower a negro woman by the name of Sarah sixteen years old, complexion - one black red streak & furniture of her own selection and the sum of One thousand and Sixty five dollars in cash to be paid to her by my Executor and if my said Daughter should die before any time fixed or certain the property hereby given

to her to be equally divided between my Brother and sister to his
James Hightower & Anna B. Butts, County of Alameda, Blanche
Hightower & Lropy Hightower. The said Brothers and Sisters
I will and bequeath to my Daughter Blanche Hightower a negro
man by the name of Jeppe Twenty three years old dark complexion
and eleven hundred Dollars in money to be paid to her by my heirs
and if my said Daughter Blanche should die without any living child
or children the property hereby given to her to go to her Sister Lropy
during her life it not in her power to give her other half Brother & Sister named in
the tenth Clause of my Will or their legal representatives also a
suitable Stock furniture of her own choosing.

Item 12th I will and bequeath to my Daughter Lropy Hightower a negro
girl sixteen years old to ten years old by the name of
Amelia and sometime standid and still lies Delays in money to
be paid to her by my executors and if my said Daughter Lropy should
die without any living child or children the property hereby given
to her to go to her Sister Blanche if in life, if not in life then to her other
full Brother & Sister named in the tenth Clause of this my Will or
to their legal representatives etc a suitabla Stock furniture of her own
choosing.

Item 13th I will and bequeath to my Daughter Anna B. Almands wife of
Jeppe Almand a negro woman eighteen years old with a blanket on her and money in the possession of the said
wife Jeppe Almand her name not mentioned but the sum of eleven hundred
Dollars in money to be paid to her by my executors
free from the liability or responsibility of her present or a future husband
and at her death to her then living children.

Item 14th It is my will and desire that James Hightower my son & Jeppe G.
Butts my son in law act as trustees for my two Daughters Blanche & Lropy
Hightower who are blind.

Item 15th I will and desire that all my property both real and personal not
bequeathed or named in the foregoing Clauses of this my Will of whatever
nature it may be to be sold in a tract of twelve months by my executors
and the proceeds thereof after paying my just debts to be applied to the
payment of the Specific Legacies named in money in this my last
Will and Testament and to the property sold should not be sufficient
to pay the Specific Legacies herein named then each Legatee is to take
equal in amount if on the other hand there should be more than
enough to satisfy the Specific Legacies then the Surplus to be equally
divided between all my surviving Children or their legal representatives.

Item 16th I hereby constitute and appoint my Son James Hightower Executor of this
my last Will & Testament This 28th day of July 1852.
