

Last Will and Testament of Mary P. Pate Recorded

State of Georgia Harris County

I, Mary Pate, being sensible of the uncertainty of human life do make and ordain hereby my last will & Testament as follows:

In as much as my son, Joseph B. Pate is naturally entitled to one half of my earthly effects; and my two Grand Children John Joseph and Bernice Lawrence are naturally entitled to the other half at my death

I do hereby devise, that should the said Joseph B. Pate die, leaving no child, the part of my effects naturally falling to him shall be inherited & enjoyed by my said Grand Children John Joseph and Bernice Lawrence hereby revoking all former Wills & bequests

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Joseph B. Pate as Executor of this my last Will

Pate sign, seal, deliver and publish the said paper writing now presented in open Court as her last Will & Testament, freely, voluntarily and of her own accord without any compulsion or undue influence whatever, that at the time of the Execution of said Will said Testatrix was of sound & disposing mind & memory, that deponent signed said Will as a witness in the presence of the Testatrix and at her request and in the presence of the other witnesses & that he saw W. E. Harley, & S. J. Whalley the other witnesses sign said Will in the presence of the Testatrix and at her request
