

Last Will and Testament of Mary Thomlinson Recorded

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen, I Mary Thomlinson
Harris County } of the county and State aforesaid being old and
infirm and of sound disposing mind and memory conceiving
the uncertainty of this mortal life blessed be God for his mercies for
the same, I make this to be my last Will and Testament in the
following manner to wit -

- Item 1st - I give all of my just-claims out of my property
Item 2nd - I give my son Benjamin Thomlinson to have five Dollars out of my Estate
Item 3rd - It is my wish and desire that my son in law Eliza Hoorn and his heirs
have five Dollars out of my Estate
Item 4th - I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Daniel five Dollars
Item 5th - I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Ware all the balance
of my property for her sole use during her natural life not to be
controlled by her husband in any way whatever for any of his
contracts - and at her death to go to the heirs of my daughter Mary
Ware ~~and~~ to be used for my son in law Zachary Ware's debts in
any manner, whatsoever the property mentioned in the fifth Item
consisting of two negroes to wit: Ben a negro man about thirty
six years old and a girl Nina about twenty six years old and
one horse, household and kitchen furniture
Item 6th - I appoint my son in law Zachary Ware my Executor to
carry out this my last Will and Testament
In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this
4th of February, 1850.

Ware named and appointed in a paper writing purporting to be the last
Will & Testament of Mary Thomlinson late of said County deceased and

Buchanan and Dennis Miller two of the subscribing witnesses to said
paper writing, who being duly sworn depose and say, that they saw
the said Testatrix Mary Thomlinson, sign, Seal, deliver and publish the
said paper writing now presented in open Court as her last Will & Tes-
tament, freely voluntarily and of her own accord without any com-
pulsion or influence whatever - that at the time of the execution of
said Will said Testatrix was of sound, disposing mind & memory, that
deponents signed said Will as witnesses in the presence of the Testa-
trix and at her request and in the presence of each other - and
that they saw William McClain the other witness sign said Will
in her presence and at her request
