State of Georgia, Mr. Miles J. Robinson & Joseph Miller, N.H. Barden & Jeremiah Shoemaker were present on Monday, the first day of December Eighteen hundred and Fifty One at the residence of William Hlap Marriages man before and at the time of his death about one hour and a half before his death in perfect possession of his mental faculties, he called on N.H. Barden to write his will. Mr. Barden proceeded to write his will agreeably to his desire, as herein after stated, after the will was reduced to writing and before the signing of the same, he dictated

It was his desire as expressed to us, that all his just debts be paid by his Administrator, that it was his desire, that all his property both Real and Personal be equally divided between his wife Amelia Hlap and his ten children, to wit, Jane Gilliam formerly said Hlap, Rachael L. Hlap, Margaret E. Hlap, Samina Hlap, Dorcas A. Hlap, William S. Hlap, Joseph T. Hlap, Martha E. Hlap, Anna S. Hlap, Henry H. Hlap.

That no division of his property be made until his youngest child becomes of age, unless this or some of age should desire a division, in order to obtain their portion, he should marry, in either of these events, it was his desire that their portions be allotted to them, but otherwise to be kept together and their portions given to them as they become of age or die away.

It was his desire and he wished it very perfectly understood, that, That portion of his Estate given to Jane Gilliam, the wife of John Gilliam, was given to her and her children free from the now debts of her husband John Gilliam, or any debts that may hereafter be contracted by him, also free from the debts of any future husband but the same to rest in his hands his children in fee simple immediately after his death.
