 were present on Monday the first day of December Eighteen hundred
 and fifty one at the Residence of William Hap married Man
 before and at the time of his death about one hour and a half before
 his death in perfect possession of his mental faculties, he called on
 N.H. Barden to write his Will, Mr Barden proceeds to write his
 Will agreeably to his desire, as herein after stated, after the Will was
 reduced to writing, and before the signing of the same, he dies.

It was his desire as expressed to us, that all his just debts be
 paid by his Administrator, that, it was his desire, that all his
 property both Real and Personal, be equally divided between his
 wife Ann Maria Hap and his ten children, to wit, Jane Gill and
 formerly Jane Hap, Rachael C. Hap, Margaret C. Hap, Samuels
 Hap, Dorcas A. Hap, William S. Hap, Joseph V. Hap, Martha
 E. Hap, Laura T. Hap, Henry L. Hap.

That no division of his property be made until his youngest
 child be come of age, unless three more of age should desire
 a division, in order to obtain their portions, or should marry, in
 either of these events, it was his desire that their portions be allotted
 to them, but otherwise to be kept together and their portions given
 to them as they become of age or marry.

It was his desire and he wished it very properly understood that
 that portion of his Estate given to Jane Gillam the wife of John
 Gillam, was given to her and her children free from the now debts
 of her husband John Gillam, or any debts that may hereafter be
 contracted by him, also free from the debts of any future husband
 but the same to rest in her and her children in fee simple -
 immediately after he dies.
