

Last Will and Testament of Moses J. Warren Esq; Recorarue

State of Georgia } In the name of God. Amen
Karris County } I Moses J. Warren of the said State and County
being now sorely afflicted and knowing that I must shortly depart
this life, deem it right and proper, both as respects my family and
self, that I shuld make a disposition of the property which
Almighty Providence has blessed me, as therefore make this my
last will and testament.

1st Item

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent manner.
My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope
for everlasting life through the merits and a testimony of the blessed
Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

2nd Item

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Sarah C. Lot
of Land No (403) four hundred and three in the fifth district
of originally Muscogee but now Harris County, containing
One thousand and fifty acres more or less. It being the property
which I now have, with all the rights, members and appurtenan-
ces, to said lot of land, in any wise belonging, during her nat-
ural life only. At her death said land with all its appurtenan-
ces shall revert back to my estate, and be sold and divided
equally among my heirs.

3rd Item

I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah & my man Servant-
Arose, my woman Servant Mission, and my Servant Girl Harriet
to her forever - I also give unto my wife Sarah & my house hold and
the other furniture, one years provisions of Corn, powder, meat, Shells
two Cows and Calves, one Sow and Pig.

4th Item

I will and desire that my Sister in law Miss Louisa M. Christian
shall live with my wife Sarah, during her life while single and
to enjoy the same as her home.

5th Item

I will and devise, that the balance of my negro property, with
a servant Girl Maria which I have already given off to my
daughter Susan Brady, shall be equally divided with my chil-
dren Richard C. Susan, William C. and Asbury J. Warren

6th Item

The remainder residue of my property not named in this will
of whatever character it may be, I will and desire to be
sold and appropriated to the debts, whatever are remaining
after the payment of debts I want equally divided between
my children already named in this will.

7th Item

I hereby constitute and appoint my Son in Law King Brady,
executor and my beloved wife Sarah C. Executrix of this
my last will and testament M. J. Warren
this November 28th 1839.

Signed, sealed, and declared and published by Moses J. Warren as
his last will and testament, in the presence of us the subscribers
who subscribe our names hereunto, in the presence of said testator
at his dwelling place and residence on the 28th of November
this November 28th 1839.
