

# Pulaski T. Trammell's Will Recorded

In the name of God Amen, I Pulaski T. Trammell being of sound mind and disposing mind and memory, calling to mind the frailty and uncertainty of human life and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs and directing how the estate, which it has pleased God to bless me shall be disposed of after my decease, while I have strength and capacity so to do make and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making null and void all other last Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made and first I commend my immortal being to him who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried with little expense or ostentation by my Executors hereafter named:—and as to my worldly estate and all the property Real and Personal or mixed of which I shall die seized and possess or to which I shall ~~be seized and possess~~ ~~be entitled~~ be entitled at the time of my decease I devise, bequeath and dispose thereof in the following manner to wit: My Will is that all my just debts and funeral charges shall by my Executors hereinafter named be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as shall by my Executors be found convenient

- Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann E. Trammell my double case gold Watch
- Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give devise and bequeath to my son Wm. Dagap my crystal face gold Watch
- Item 3<sup>rd</sup> It is my Will as my children herein named be wit Wm. Dagap, Meador Amelba, Algernon Crittenden Shall become of age or marry in the event of either taking place, for them to draw each one fourth of my estate except my lands in Harris County whereon I now live which I intend to dispose of in another Item
- Item 4<sup>th</sup> It is furthermore my Will that my Grey Horse and buggy my medical books and all that appertains to my profession be sold at any time and in any way that my Executors may think best. It is also my Will that the balance of my estate be kept together on the plantation that I now live upon and each child's part given off at the time herein appointed and when last child receives its portion the remainder shall belong to my Wife Ann E. Trammell during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between my three children Wm. Dagap, Meador Amelba, Algernon Crittenden
- Item 5<sup>th</sup> Should either of my children die before they become of age or marry I desire that their living shall draw their proportion as mentioned in third Item
- Item 6<sup>th</sup> It is further my Will that my beloved wife above named have my entire plantation whereon I now live during her natural life for the sole benefit of my beloved wife and three children herein named, but said life interest in said plantation shall not be transferable and not be cultivated by any persons hands except my said wife and children and at her death to be sold and equally divided between my children heretofore named
- Item 7<sup>th</sup> It is further my Will that my children be educated out of the profits arising from my farming interest or otherwise. Should there be any more made on my farm above a good support for my wife and children I wish it to be used for the benefit of my said wife and children as my Executors shall think best and proper
- Item 8<sup>th</sup> I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Ann E. Trammell my Executor of this my last Will and Testament this 29 January
