

Last will & Testament of Robert L. Hendry Decd

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen,
Harris County } I Robert Lee Hendry of said State
and County being of advanced age but of sound disposing
mind and memory knowing that I must shortly de-
part this life, desire it right and proper both as re-
spect my family and my self that I should make a
disposition of the property with which a kind providence
has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will
and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others
by me heretofore made.

- Item 1st - I desire and direct that my body be buried in
a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my
circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust
shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope
for salvation through the merits and atonement of the
blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
- Item 2nd - I desire and direct that all my just debts
be paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter named
and appointed.
- Item 3rd - I give bequeath and devise to my beloved chil-
dren, Mary Ann Hendry one fourth of my Estate
and my son Lee Reed Hendry one fourth of my Estate
- Item 4th - I give and bequeath the remaining half of my
Estate to Robt. Evans Hendry, Rowan Ward Hendry
and William Perham Hendry, my sons each
one receiving an equal share, my son Robert Evans I send
my is to receive one horse named Bulah as a part
of his legacy, I desire especially that my son Rowan-
ward Hendry receive his legacy when my son Robert
E. Hendry and my daughter Mary Ann Hendry receive
theirs first notwithstanding his now age.
- Item 5th - I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Willis
Jones my Executor of this my last will & Testament
This the 10th day of December 1868
