

Last Will and Testament of Samuel Harris late Rec'd
State of Georgia In the name of God Amen.
County of Harris I Samuel Harris of said State and County being of
sound mind, and knowing that I must shortly depart this life, do make and
profer both as respects my family and myself, that henceforth to have
possession of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me,
therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all
hereof before made by me.

1st Item I desire and direct, that my body be buried in a decent and Christian
like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life, my
soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, and hope for
eternal salvation through the merits and atonements of the blessed Son
and Savior Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed, and by Almighty
trust enjoyed for many years.

2nd Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay
be my executors here or after appointed as I am unwilling that
Christianity and virtue be cast down in this neighborhood, especially amongst the
poor and destitute.

3rd Item I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Frances Ann Harris
all the slaves that I may receive, or my Estate may receive from the
Estate of Gen. Governmental Sasse S. Kimbrough, in right of my wife
Frances A. Harris, and in addition to the above I give and bequeath
unto my wife, the following named negroes, to wit: Sammonson and
his wife Phoebe, and their two children, Thomas, the name of the other
not remembered, I give to my wife Frances A. an absolute title
to all of the above mentioned property to dispose of as she deems best.

4th Item I give and bequeath the balance of my estate to my two sons William
Clayton and James Harris, each to have the same amount.

I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Frances Ann
Executive, and my worthy Sons William Clayton and James Harris
executors of this my last Will and Testament this Number
30th 1858.

Last Will & Testament of Samuel Heavis and Continued

Georgia Harris County

Befor me come, on the 5th day of July 1864 at Chambers, for the purpose of proving the last Will and Testament of Samuel Heavis, the testator, to Bain Will, his, Perry R. Scott and James Cox two of the subscribing witnesses. And the Will having been brought before me, for Probate by two of the Executors to wit, Frances Ann Heavis and William Colleton Heavis, they the said witnesses, depose of the same, that they saw said Samuel Heavis, sign and publish the same as his last Will & Testament on the day and year, there above, as executors by him; that they witnessed the same, at his request in his presence and in presence of each other; that the same was voluntarily executed by him, while it was a bona fide act of his will and mind and memory.
