delay by my executor hereinafter named and appointed -
3rd I give bequeath and devise unto my children A. S.
Mays, Arminda Edwards, M. J. Mays, Julia M. Shaw and
Henry Emory all of my property real and personal and all
of my property whatever description I may own at the
time of my death to be equally divided among them
share and share alike, each one of said children first
accounting at a fair Valuation for all property I may have
given him or her since the first day of June Eighteen Hundred
Sixty five.

4th It is my Will and desire that neither one of my said
Children shall account for any property I have given him
or her before the said first day of June Eighteen Hundred
Sixty five.

5th I hereby constitute and appoint Mason J. Jones
Executor of this my last Will and Testament this May
26th 1874.
