

Smith Cotton's Will — Recorded.

Georgia Harris County

In the Name of God Amen I Smith Cotton of the said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this World deem it right and proper both as regards myself and my family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a Heaven sendee has blessed me therefore make this my last will and Testament revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me

Item first

I desire to direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian manner suitable to circumstances and condition, my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed and as I have trusted in you for Sixty five years

Item second

I desire and direct that all my just be paid without delay by my executors hereinafter named as I am unwilling that my executors should be delayed of their rights especially as there is no necessity for delay

Item third

I give and devise to my beloved wife Eliza White the use of my Master Place Situation in the Village of Whitesville containing Eighty Acres of Land more or less with all the appurtenances thereto belonging during her natural life or widowhood, also a negro Man Isaac about fifty years of age a negro Girl Julian about twelve years of age my Horse and Buggy a bed and furniture and such an amount of my household and Kitchen furniture as she will need for house keeping One Cow and Calf such as she may select of all my Stock my entire set of Blackstone Commentaries on the Holy Bible and one years provisions with all the poultry &c during her life or widowhood and at her death or marriage I will all that I have devised her the use of he divided by my executors equally among my legatees whose amount of my estate is not particularly specified in this will I also that in the event of my disposing or losing any of the property herein devised to my wife that my executors shall appropriate to her such other property or money of my estate as will be equal value to that thus disposed of

Item fourth

I give and devise to my Grand Daughter Anna Maria Counter a Negro boy by the name of Africa about twenty five years of age to her and her children free from the disposal of her present or any future husband I give and devise to the children of my daughter Louvany Stubbs and if there should be any such children living Six Hundred Dollars to be paid by my executors in twelve months after my death

Item fifth

I give and devise to my Grand Children Pleasant Badger Some Badger Augustus Badger Three Hundred dollars to each of them to be paid by my executors within twelve months after my death

Item sixth

I give and devise to my Grand Children Leonora Burford James Burford and Celestia Burford such three hundred dollars to be paid also by my executors in twelve months after my death; Also I give and devise to my Daughter Martha Burford in the event that she should be alone left by her husband and left in a destitute situation before my death to have been distributed four hundred dollars to be paid as above specified to the paying of others

Item eighth

I give and devise to my Grand Daughter Jane Thomas five hundred dollars and my Grand Son Joseph Thomas five hundred and ten dollars extra of the amount he now has both the amount to be paid by my executors in twelve months after my death

Smith Cotton's Will - Continued

I will and devise to my Son William G. and my Son Stephen G. and Son James G. their children and the children of my daughter Lucy Neill Rennon deceased, if any of said children should be living all the remainder of my estate to be equally divided among the four specific legatees consisting of both real and personal property money notes or any other effects whatsoever; and as I have given to my children at sundry times the use of property and money and taken their receipts or notes therefor the notes bearing interests the receipt not I desire my Executors in the Settlements with the legatees set forth in this Item that that they should cause the notes and receipts that I hold against the four last named legatees to be settled by them as a part of each one distributive share

I now constitute and appoint my beloved Son James G. and my worthy friend John G. Little and John G. Andrews to this my Last Will and Testaments this June 13th 1854
