

The Last will & Testament of Cynthia Pearce

In the name of God. Amen

I Cynthia Pearce of Harris County State of Georgia being of sound disposing mind and memory and being desirous to dispose of my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do, do make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me, and I first commit my soul to God who gave it and desire my body to be buried in the family burying ground. My worldly Estate I dispose of as follows,

- Item 1st — I give and bequeath to my son Wm. G. Pearce two beds and bedding one large chest one set of Cottage chairs, all my stock of hogs, all my interest in the corn, fodder, wheat, and all the possessions of horses.
- Item 2nd — I give and bequeath to my step daughter Eliza Jane Johnson one bed and bedstead.
- Item 3rd — I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Eunice C. Robinson one bed and bedstead.
- Item 4th — I give and bequeath to my daughter Carolina Roberts fifty dollars in money & one white cow and calf.
- Item 5th — I give and bequeath to my daughter Willie Francis Pearce all the remainder of my worldly possessions consisting in house hold and kitchen furniture one cow and calf one speckling hog, interest in the land of cotton except the fifty dollars given in item 4. — in this my will after all expenses are paid, also my interest in the growing crop.
- Item 6th — I hereby constitute my son Wm. G. Pearce executor of this my last will and I desire and empower him to execute and deliver to each one all that has been given in items 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 without sale as he may see best and at such time as will be most suitable to all.
