with which I have been blessed make this my last
will and Testament -

Item 1st I will and bequeath to Vina Walker widow of my
brother John J. Walker five hundred dollars and to Francis
Walker a colored woman my two metal chests and
bale and my house hold and kitchen furniture and
to William Walker colored my mule Rhoda and to
Linda Walker and Sarah Ann Walker children of Paula
Walker (colored) fifty dollars each, and to Henrietta Beall
wid. of Robert Beall (colored) fifty dollars to be paid out
of my Estate.

Item 2nd I will and direct that all of my other property both
real and personal, not otherwise disposed of by deed
or gift to A. L. Moore and Francis Walker (colored) and
her five children, shall be sold by my Executors here-
inafter named and the proceeds of the same after
paying all of my just debts be paid over to my
beloved brother William M. Walker.

Item 3rd I desire my body to be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner.

Item 4th I hereby appoint my brother Austin M. Walker and
my friend William J. Thurston Executors to execute
this my last will and Testament.

In Testimony whereof I Thacker V. Walker have freely
and voluntarily made this my will and have
called witnesses to witness the same, and to see
me sign this my will.
